The need for affordable housing and services for older adults has expanded nationally - and locally. With housing, rental and health care costs soaring, older adults are now at greater risk of homelessness than at any time in recent history, according to [Justice in Aging](#).

Fellowship Square is working tirelessly to help. Our four communities provide well-managed, safe and attractive apartment living for some 800+ individuals who meet **low-income** criteria set by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). We offer **vital services and programs** that help our residents lead healthy and active lifestyles.

While housing costs are supported by funding from HUD, we rely on individual, corporate and congregational donations to cover expenses that our residents can't afford to pay. **Your financial assistance** helps cover residents' costs associated with:

- Emergency food (gift cards)
- Non-covered prescriptions
- Co-pays associated with doctor's and dentist's visits
- Non-covered expenses for hearing aids
- Transportation
- Other services and activities

Fellowship House residents have very limited incomes and access to resources. We appreciate **donations of tangible goods** to support their lives and help offset expenses that hamper their ability to make ends meet.
